It was during the COVID 19 pandemic in 2020, that we received a call from our social worker. At iKhaya LikaBaba 'House of the Father', Loressa and her amazing team made it possible for us to finally meet our baby... Our precious baby boy! With their warm welcome, support and care, being first time parents, allowing us day and night visits, weekend visits and finally baby spent a day out with us, and then a weekend with us. Within two weeks, Dad, mum and baby boy couldn't stay away from each other! It was instant connection and bonding. We could smell baby even though he wasn't with us. We couldn't help but tear

as we left iKhaya LikaBaba to go home after every visit. The day we brought our little baby boy home, the house felt like it had been waiting for him all along. It wasn't just the perfectly decorated nursery or the stack of new baby books & toys, but an unspoken warmth that radiated from every corner, a feeling that our family was finally complete.

We had been on the foster list since 2010, miscarriage after miscarriage, 14 failed iui's and fertility treatments, then suddenly God intervened and our foster-adoption journey began, filled with moments of hope, love and joy. The moment we held his tiny hand; it was as if we were meant to be together. We remembered looking into his brown eyes, talking to him, 'Baby you're coming home with us'.

Today, J is a vibrant, cheerful, brilliant little boy who lights up our lives with his laughter, kindness & love. He's a genius for his age. His adoption is not just a chapter in our story, it's the very foundation of our family, a testament to the incredible bond that can form through faith, love, and the beautiful gift of adoption. J is now a 4 ½ year old, and it is so clear to us, that God picked him for us. It is amazing how he fits our personalities so well. More and more every day we are so thankful to his birthmother for her selfless decision.

It is so hard to express in words what a unique experience adoption has been for us. It has been quite a journey facing infertility, as well as so many unknowns and acts of kindness and sacrifice—all with so many emotions—which led to the growth of our family. There were times when our faith was shaken, and we weren't sure if we could handle our cross. But adopting J has made us more aware of God's power and of his love for us. We realize that he always has a perfect plan for our lives. God has an incredible plan for Baby J.

Our love is real. Our family is real. God is real. We prayed for Baby J and we were gifted with our greatest blessing. Our family is defined by love, not by blood. We didn't give J the gift of life, life has given us the gift of him.

SHAPING TOMORROW






